Dear Neighbors,

It's been very busy around Town in the three months since my February quarterly newsletter! Belated congratulations to new Commissioners Irene Kirdahy and Don Taggart, and also to the Town's first official Town Manager, Bob Kellogg. The new team hit the ground running after the March election, and immediately started workshops to discuss a long-range (5-year) fiscal plan. These workshops will be held regularly until the plan has been finalized. Dates for the workshops will be posted on the Town website, and anyone interested in providing input is welcome to attend. This long-range planning process is a first for Hillsboro Beach!

Another first is the "Town of Hillsboro Beach Information Guide." Hopefully you received your copy earlier this month via snail-mail. This little booklet is meant to facilitate communication between residents/property owners and Town Hall. Included are interesting facts about our town, as well as important contact information and a gorgeous aerial view of "Florida's Magnificent Mile." If you did not receive a copy, please stop by Town Hall.

Regarding the pending situation with Deerfield and our official request (made July 8, 2015) for the conditions in their groin permits to be enforced as mandated by the State when the groins were installed, a **mediation date of June 9th has been set**. This is the final effort to avoid litigation and the last phase of the multi-step process required by Florida Statute. This mediation is not open to the public, however, a recap will be posted on my website (www.debtarrant.com) as soon afterwards as possible. A recap via email will also be sent to residents who are on my email list. My list is independent of the list maintained at Town Hall and includes only people who have contacted me directly.

What happens next regarding the groins depends on the June 9th outcome. The Town has spent \$27M (in 2015 dollars) on the beach since the groins were installed. Just since the 1998 nourishment, beach expenses have been over \$17M, or roughly **an average of \$1M each year for the past 17 years**, on an annual budget of \$5M to \$6M - half of which covers the Police Department. We will continue to pay \$1M per year through 2020 for the beach, nearly all of which will go towards loan payments for sand that's been gone for years. If it wasn't for Deerfield's groins artificially trapping sand that would otherwise come to us naturally, the 2011 nourishment may have lasted until the loan was paid off. Obviously we cannot continue to borrow money to buy sand that lasts only 1/3 of the time it takes to pay off the loan. This is why we've had to take a stand. The terms of the groin permits need to be enforced. Without a long-term solution, history will continue to repeat itself.
